Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Reader 1: Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12).

All: Come, Lord Jesus, come quickly.

Reader 2: "The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be

great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." (Luke 1:30-33).

We light this candle to remind us of Mary, who was willing, first of all people, to let the light of God shine through her and bring the Saviour to the world. Through her faithfulness and love, Jesus, the Prince of Peace, was born to us.

The fourth candle is lit.

Reader 3: Let us pray. O Heavenly Father, who called Mary to be the Mother of Jesus, so that the world could be saved and brought to new birth, help us to bring the peace of Christ to birth wherever there is darkness and despair, and to work for the coming of your kingdom. Amen.
