During this hymn, the Blessed Sacrament, the consecrated bread and wine, is taken in procession to the Calvary Chapel, our Gethsemane for this evening.

- 1. Now, my tongue, the mystery telling, of the glorious body sing, and the blood, all price excelling, which the nations' Lord and King, once on earth among us dwelling, shed for this world's ransoming.
- 2. That last night, at supper lying with the twelve, his chosen band, Jesus, with the law complying, keeps the feast its rites demand; then, more precious food supplying, gives himself with his own hand.
- 3. Word made flesh, by word he maketh very bread his flesh to be, wine his blood for whoso taketh; and if senses fail to see, faith alone the true heart waketh to behold the mystery.
- 4. Therefore we, before him bending, this great sacrament revere; types and shadows have their ending, for the newer rite is here; faith, our outward sense befriending, makes our inward vision clear.
- 5. Glory let us give, and blessing, to the Father and the Son; honour, thanks, and praise addressing while eternal ages run, and the Spirit's power confessing, who from both with both is one.

Reading: Matthew 26:30-46 (please remain kneeling)

When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. Then Jesus said to them, 'You will all become deserters because of me this night; for it is written, "I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered." But after I am raised up, I will go ahead of you to Galilee.' Peter said to him, 'Though all become deserters because of you, I will never desert you.' Jesus said to him, 'Truly I tell you, this very night, before the cock crows, you will deny me three times.' Peter said to him, 'Even though I must die with you, I will not deny you.' And so said all the disciples.

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray.' He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be grieved and agitated. Then he said to them,

'I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me.' And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed, 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not what I want but what you want.' Then he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, 'So, could you not stay awake with me one hour? Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.' Again he went away for the second time and prayed, 'My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done.' Again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. So leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words. Then he came to the disciples and said to them, 'Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Get up, let us be going. See, my betrayer is at hand.'

- 15. My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my <u>mouth</u>; and you have laid me <u>in</u> the dust of the grave.
- 16. Packs of dogs close me in, and gangs of evildoers circle a<u>round</u> me; they pierce my hands and my feet; I <u>can</u> count all my bones.
- 17 They stare and gloat over <u>me</u>; they divide my garments among them; they cast lots <u>for</u> my clothing.

18. Be not far away, O Lord;

you are my strength; hasten to help me.

19. Save me from the <u>sword</u>, my life from the <u>pow</u>er of the dog.

20. Save me from the <u>li</u>on's mouth, my wretched body from the <u>horns</u> of wild bulls.

21. I will declare your name to my <u>breth</u>ren; in the midst of the congregation <u>I</u> will praise you.

22. Praise the Lord, you that <u>fear</u> him; stand in awe of him, O offspring of Israel; all you of Jacob's <u>line</u>, give glory.

23. For he does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither does he hide his face from them;

but when they cry to <u>him</u> he hears them.

24. My praise is of him in the great as<u>sem</u>bly; I will perform my vows in the presence of <u>those</u> who worship him.

- 25. The poor shall eat and be satisfied, and those who seek the Lord shall <u>praise</u> him: "May your heart <u>live</u> for ever!"
- 26. All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the <u>Lord</u>, and all the families of the nations shall <u>bow</u> before him.
- 27. For kingship belongs to the <u>Lord</u>; he rules o<u>ver</u> the nations.
- 28. To him alone all who sleep in the earth bow down in <u>wor</u>ship; all who go down to the dust <u>fall</u> before him.

After the altar has been stripped, the lights in the church will be extinguished.

Immediately following the service, a prayer vigil will be kept for one hour downstairs in the Chapel in the presence of the Sacrament. Come and watch and wait with Jesus in the Garden during this time of Agony and offer him the gift of love and friendship. All are welcome.

The congregation is requested to leave the church in silence once the lights in the side aisle are turned on.

A Note about Maundy Thursday

The Eucharist tonight is a liturgy of contrasts. Everything begins on a note of triumph – the white hangings, the music, and the joyful ringing of bells. Everything is "just fine." We say that about ourselves too, until we realize how easily we can become the pawns of evil.

This is set forth in the liturgy of this evening as the glory and love of the gathering in the Upper Room are apparently cast down by the powers of darkness. The altar is stripped as Jesus was stripped. The altar is washed – a preparation for the events of Good Friday, when the body of Christ was taken from the cross, prepared for burial, and placed in the tomb.

Christ's sacramental presence with us, under the forms of bread and wine, is taken in procession to the place where it will be reverently reserved this evening.

And now we wait for the events to unfold in the Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday, when we shall come face to face with the Cross.
